

## **FORT WORTH CONTRACTOR DYNA TEN EARNS WORKERS' COMP INSURANCE SAFETY DIVIDEND**

**FORT WORTH, TX**, September 2005 – The mechanical contractor that helped build Fort Worth's Bass Hall and the Texas Motor Speedway has earned an \$81,000 dividend from its workers' comp insurance providers because of the company's good safety record.

Representatives of Dyna Ten Corporation ([www.dynaten.com](http://www.dynaten.com)) accepted the dividend payment this week from CompGroup AGC, a purchasing group that buys workers' comp insurance for Texas members of the Associated General Contractors of America (AGC). CompGroup AGC earlier had received a total of \$2.25 million in dividends for its members from Texas Mutual, the largest workers' comp underwriter in Texas.

Dyna Ten was the recipient of the largest single company dividend among the purchasing group's members statewide. Over the past five years, Dyna Ten has received back in dividends nearly 16 percent of the workers' comp insurance premiums that it initially paid.
